Learning is more than memorizing facts; it involves constructive arguments, debates, hands-on experiences, and critical thinking. Education should be seen as a privilege, not drudgery. Hickory Christian Academy (HCA) has instilled in its students an innate desire to learn. However, the school acknowledges that education should align with each child's natural inclinations, rather than forcing them into conventional learning. Parents and students alike express satisfaction with the school's emphasis on safety and family involvement. While opinions may vary regarding sports events, traditions, and extracurricular activities, most agree that the teachers provide engaging lessons and genuinely care for their students' well-being. One parent shares a positive experience at HCA, attributing her child's success to the school's nurturing environment and effective teaching methods. Her sister, who attended HCA before her, went on to attend Chapel Hill University and achieved significant academic accomplishments. The school allows students to develop close relationships with the teachers. It's clear that the instructors genuinely care about each student's well-being and are approachable.
