We now have it in hand! This is a development we waited to report once we personally confirmed it. We are now in possession of a small number of copies. This complete Bible is in the Ge'ez language only, the liturgical language of the Ethiopian church, it is not a spoken living language and most Ethiopians cannot read it. Only scholrs, some priests and monks know and read Ge'ez. It would appear this edition was made with them in mind. The books of what is called the broader EOTC canon such as Josippon and all the books of the broader New Testament canon were previously not available in a single volume Bible! What is already available? Portions of the Ethiopian Orthodox Old Testament You can buy the Pseudepigrapha Volumes 1 and 2 by James Charlesworth. It contains some of the books of the EOTC Bible, along with copious scholarly notes. It also contains many other books as well which are not in the EOTC canon. You can buy Meqabyan 1-3 This translation has some elements we disagree with, but it has all 3 books of Meqabyan in English and in print. It is also available as an e-book on lulu, and each volume is available separately as well Meqabyan 1 translated by D P Curtin Mr. Curtin has a better translation of Meqabyan 1, but this is does not include 2-3, unfortunately. We recommend getting it as well however. We do not necessarily agree with all of the notes but they can often provide helpful background information. It is a better translation than the one by Feqade Selassie for just Meqabyan 1. (There is a lyrical Version of Meqabyan online by Selassie fire. It is better than not having any for free version online probably, but it is a very problematic translation because it was done to give it a lyrical quality rather than to focus on accuracy. Fortunately, the print one by Feqade on Lulu isnt lyrical and has been improved.) Portions of the Ethiopian Orthodox New Testament Ethiopic Didascalia By James Mason Harden (Be careful, there is a non-Ethiopic Didascalia and it is a different book in terms of content. Also some Didascalia editions are abridged. This is the best one we have seen thus far in print now.) The other one by Platt is an incomplete one. The Statutes Of The Apostles This book is in multiple languages and includes translations from the Ethiopian and other versions. This work corresponds with part of what is called Sinodos but it is incomplete. You can also get it free in pdf at this link. We also link to some of the EOTC Bible in English as free pdf files under our links tab at the top of this site! We know that many people would like a single bound volume containing all the books. There isnt one though because some of them havent been translated into English yet. The goal of this project is to translate the remaining books into English. Just obtaining all of the books is not easy. Once again, even in Ethiopia there isnt a single print volume containing all of the books at this time. There should be, and we hope there will be in the future. Some of the books of the broader canon are in fact hard to find. In our last post, we noted that we were working on purchasing it. It has since arrived.You may click the image above or below, to see the cover, or title page enlarged.The book covers the history of ancient Israel. The publisher chose an image of Mary holding the infant Christ for the cover, although it is an Old Testament book, from the greater EOTC canon. It is definitely the right book however! The large title on the cover, and the title page at the top, reads Zna Ayhud In Amharic. We have also obtained the complete Hebrew text of Josippon. The Hebrew text is substantially different, and much longer. By having both texts, we could produce a future critical edition, noting all of the differences between the two, wherever they occur. Having two different texts for comparison could only aid the quality of the translation.Your support made it possible for us to obtain the book! We would like to thank everyone who donated. It includes 81 books, and the broader canon also adds 9 more books on top of that. Their language is often rendered as one of the eldest's written languages and a possible candidate for the original language spoken by Adam along with the hieroglyphs and pre-hieratic languages of ancient Egypt. Ethiopia is considered the heart of Africa by many and is a prominent center for Orthodoxy and Christianity. The Holy See of Tekle Haymanot is considered representative of the kingship or restoration of the Solomonic dynasty. The love story of King Solomon and the Queen of Sheba holds high significance to them, as Sheba could be an ancient Ethiopian city. The Ethiopian Tewahedo Bible is difficult to find an authentic copy of online (especially when not written in Amharic) due to copies including the non-canonical version of Enoch over its canonical version or heterodox Rastafarian copies that are heretical to the Ethiopian Orthodox Church. There have been some efforts in modern scholarship and pop culture to promote the usage of the Ethiopian Tewahedo Bible or bibles like the Monastic Coptic Bible (which include the Septuagint or Canonical Greek to Coptic translations). These efforts may include advocating for their usage(s) over the protestant KJV bible. The KJV may have been favored due the Gutenberg Press and the Gutenberg Bible leading to the KJV bible winning in popularity. Outside of the political ramifications, accessibility or largely scaled printing was a race in which these ancient translations didn't win for mass adoption.
