Cheaper than a trip to France, and just as meaningful, a book can help you travel the world. And a childrens book can teach your child about different cultures and traditions without the fuss of getting on a plane and going abroad. There are so many wonderful French childrens books available today that it can be hard to choose from them all. Kids books have always been an important part of French culture, with many great titles that are classics and have stood the test of time. As a parent here in Paris, these are the books that I have noticed are the most popular in stores, and with parents. I've broken down the French language books by age, so that you can find the titles that will most appeal to your kids. For older children, I've picked titles that are classics, some of which are read in classrooms as part of literature reading. I should also note that if you have children who prefer to read comic books (pictures always help!), here is my list of the best French comics. I will always believe that children should be eager readers, and that they should have an opportunity to learn about life far off places through the written word. And so with that, here are the best French Childrens books for kids of all ages. The Petit Loup (meaning Little Wolf) series is a classic. Wolves play a large role in the French imagination, and to contrast with the wicked wolf in Little Red Riding hood and other stories, Petit Loup is a toddler who is just trying to navigate his daily routine with his parents. Written byOrienne Lallemand and illustrated byIlyonore Thuillier, there are numerous books in this series that toddlers will enjoy. With everything from going to bed to baking a cake, little kids will enjoy reading about his quotidian. Buy Now Another favorite of the pre-schooler set is Petit Ours Brun, meaning Little Brown Bear. It began originally as a story in the French magazine Pomme dApi in 1975, before being turned into a book, and eventually a tv cartoon series. The story is about a little bear who is 3 years old and aims to be a good little kid, despite his first instincts. There are hundreds of stories in the Petit Ours Brun series, so your little one is bound to be entertained for hours. Buy Now Aimed at more or less the same crowd as Petit Ours Brun, Tchoupi is another favorite. This time as a young penguin, this French childrens books seriescreated byThierry Courtin. Pronouncedchoo-pi, the books have become so popular, they have also been turned into a tv series as well as been converted into English. Buy Now Les Malheurs de Sophie, which translates into English as Sophies Misfortunes is a childrens book written bytheCountess of Sgur. BornSofiya Feodorovna Rostopchina, the author was of Russian origin and became a countess when her husband was made a Peer (Comte) of France. The book was first published in 1858, and republished several times since. The story is set in a castle in the French countryside, during the2nd French Empire, under the reign of Napoleon III (nephew of Napoleon Bonaparte). Sophie is a naughty and adventurous little girl who lives with her parents and enjoys getting into trouble. Do things always work out? Read the book to find out! Buy Now You may be surprised to know that Puss in Boots, aka Chat Bott, is French. Written by famous French authorCharles Perrault in the 16th century,his other book titles include: Mother Goose Little Red Riding Hood Bluebeard Cinderella (adapted version from Grimm Brothers) Sleeping Beauty (adapted version from Grimm Brothers) Charles Perrault worked as a secretary at the Chateau de Breteuil outside of Paris, where some of his most famous works were written. The story is about ananthropomorphiccat, who is gifted to a penniless young man. Puss, however, sets off to make his masters fortune, using clever lies to attract the attention of the King and help his master marry the Kings daughter, a beautiful (and rich) princess. Young readers will enjoy admire the cats ingenuity and hold their breath, as Puss in Boots courts disaster. Written by writer Maurice LeBlanc in the early 20th century, Arsene Lupin is not a detective but a gentleman thief. Clever and resourceful, Lupin has the ability to quickly transform his appearance as he moves from one adventure to the next, in a collection of short stories. The series is so popular, it has even been turned into a tv show on Netflix. Buy Now Kids who are advanced in French will quite enjoy the stories of the Prince of Motordu, written by Pierre lie Ferrier, who goes by the initials Pef. The full title of the 1st story in the set is La belle lisse poire du prince de Motordu, meaning the beautiful smooth pear of the Prince of Motordu. If that doesnt make any sense, it is because it is a play on words. Lisse poire as in smooth pear rhymes with histoire as in story. The actual title is the beautiful stories of the Prince of Motordu. In the stories, the young prince of Motordu is invited by a young schoolteacher, Princess Dzcolle, to put language back in place. And thus young readers are launched into his colorful world of fun. In France the book is targeted at primary school readers, so the words are not difficult, but readers should have at least an intermediate level to be able to understand the jokes. You can purchase a set of 6 stories from the Prince Motordu series here: Buy Now Written and illustrated by Ludwig Bemelmans in 1939, Madeleine has remained a classic French novel for kids even since it was published. Set in Paris, the stories are written in a rhyming style and feature a little red-haired girl named Madeleine who attends boarding school. Each book starts with the following: French VersionEnglish VersionIl y lontemps, Paris, dans une vieille maison aux murs recouverts de vignes vivaient douze petites filles. La plus petite sappelait Madeleine.(A long time ago)In an old house in ParisThat was covered in vinesLived twelve little girls!The smallest one was Madeleine. There are seven stories in all, with the final book bring Madeleine to the United States to inherit a fortune. Buy Now There are 13 tales in the stories of Broca street, each written byPierre Cripiariand illustrated byClaude Lapointe. The most famous of this French childrens book series is La Sorciere de la rue Mouffetard, meaning the witch of rue Mouffetard. (Rue Mouffetard is a pedestrianized street lined with shops in the middle of Paris 5th arrondissement in the Latin quarter.) Each story features different characters, with some of the characters making guest appearances in different stories. Buy Now Another classic childrens book in French is Le Petit Nicolas. The main character, Nicolas himself, recounts his stories from a personal point of view with plenty of character and humor. Set in the 1960s, the story titles are rather ordinary with Nicolas playing in the school yard, going on holiday, and spending time at home. But much of the humor derives from Nicolas misunderstanding of adults behavior in these rather basic situations. Nicolas thinks things should be rather straightforward, and doesnt always understand all the machinations that adults get involved in. His uncomplicated childs point of view exposes the flaws of adult perception. Buy Now If you have older children, it can be difficult to get them to read books that are age-appropriate in a language that is not their native tongue, and still keep it interesting. The following books have been chosen because they come in French, with the English text side by side. The perfect way to learn new words in French and still keep it interesting. The incontestable of French books always has to be Le Petit Prince. At first glance, Le Petit Prince seems like a book for small children. However, once you start to read it, the layers of wisdom that the book does out are worthy of reading for adults and kids alike. The story follows a pilot lost in the desert after a crash-landing, who starts to hallucinate and comes upon a young prince. The prince is visiting various planets in space, including Earth, and through the story and discussion, the book addresses themes of sadness, friendship, love, and loss. The Little Prince is one of the highest-selling books of all time in France. You can buy the French-English bilingual version here: Buy Now 3 Musketeers figurines at Alexandre Dumas Chateau de Monte Cristo A historical novel written by famed novelist Alexandre Dumas, the 3 musketeers is a book filled with adventure and intrigue. A young man named D'Artagnan travels to Paris hoping to become a musketeer, one of the French Kings elite bodyguards, only to be robbed of his letter of introduction and instead getting into a duel with the 3 musketeers (of the title) Athos,PorthosandAramis. After a confluence of events, he manages to win their trust and must work with them to thwart the various spies and characters who are threatening the King and the very state of France. You can buy the French-English bilingual version here: Buy Now The Hunchback of Notre Dame may have been remade by Disney, but the original story is a bit different. The story is set in 1482, when a Romani woman named Esmeralda captures the heart of a deformed young man namedQuasimodo. Quasimodo lives isolated in the Notre-Dame de Paris, hiding in plain sight of the bustling city, under the protection of theCathedrals Archdeacon. The Archdeacon and Captain of the guards are also in love with her, with an ensuing tug of war, all set in the heart of medieval Paris. Note: this is a series of 3 books with bilingual translation with the French English versions presented together: Buy Now If youve ever opened Le Petit Prince, you know that French childrens books arent necessarily easy to understand as a French learner. Many use the pass simple, a tense even educated French people struggle with. Others use old-fashioned vocabulary you clearly dont need as a beginner. After thinking about all the childrens books I loved as a kid, I selected a few you can read and enjoy whether youre a beginner or an intermediate French learner! The beginner childrens books I selected are mostly written in the present tense and use vocabulary from everyday life which makes them relatively easy to understand. Thisclassic series of French childrens book relates the adventures of Nicolas, a French boy living in a French city in the sixties. Made up of short humorous stories about Nicolas first love, his interactions with other students and his troubles with his parents, and full of beautiful illustrations, this is an easy read and usually one of the first books French learners read in French. One of the books in the series was also turned into a movie: Les Vacances du Petit Nicolas. Mes Premiers Jaime Lire is a magazine created specificallyfor children learning how to read whose goal is to turn them into avid readers. The stories are short and sweet and all come with a CD you can listen to which is particularly useful to improve your pronunciation. Jaime Lire is another collection created by Bayard Jeunesse, the editor of Mes Premiers Jaime Lire. Created for older children, these books feature slightly more complexstories and vocabulary but these are still great choices if youre a beginner. These books dont come with audio, unfortunately. What kind of job should I do when I grow up? How to deal with the death of my beloved dog? Im in love, what should I do? These are just a few of the questions Max and Lili try to answer in this series of books. The everyday situations and language make it an excellent series of childrens books to get used to the French language as its truly spoken. Bosleys New Friends is a dual language book where you follow the adventures of Bosley, a bear who struggles to understand what other animals say as he learns to speak their language. The simple phrases, illustrations, and line-by-line translations make it an excellent book to read for French learners and parents who want to convince their children of the importance of language learning. Everybody is talking about a masked vigilante in Framboisy school. Ficelle, Franoise, Boulotte and Isabelle decide to investigate. What the group of friends doesnt know is that the vigilante may be one of them. While the original books in the Fantomette series were using the pass simple tense, the new editions mainly use the present tense which makes them much easier to read. Ratus is the series of books French children use to learn how to read. It relates the adventures of Ratus, a cheese-loving rat who also likes to cheat at games and go on adventures of all kinds. The Martine book series is a series of French childrens books many French boys and girls grew up with. Each book is dedicated to a new event in the life of Martine, a stereotypical naive countryside girl from Brittany. These are books that are much harder to read because they use the pass simple tense as well as more complex vocabulary. As a French learner, you most likely dont need to learn the pass simple because this is a tensefew people use in real-life. In fact, I still remember hearing my University professors recommend us not to use it during our exams because most students make mistakes when they use this tense. Yes, they were asking native French speakers not to use the pass simple because its too complicated! My recommendation: translate what you dont understand but dont try to memorize the pass simple conjugation. Even though its a childrens book, Le Petit Prince is a terrible choice of first French book to read. Dont get me wrong, itsan amazing book and I have fond childhood memories of my time reading it and playing the video game it inspired. Its full of lessons about friendship and life like On ne voit bien quavec le coeur, essentiel est invisible pour les yeux. (we only see well with the heart, the rest is invisible to the eyes). But its also full of complicated vocabulary and tenses like le pass simple that arent used in all spoken French. Which is why I encourage to wait to have reached an intermediate level to read it and truly enjoy it. If youre still a beginner and find the book too complicated, check out the movie! Starting with its title in which lisse poire (smooth pear) replaces the similar-sounding histoire (story), this books has charmed thousands of French people with its puns and twisted words (mots tordus). The Prince de Motordu lives in a chapeau (hat), wears a chateau (castle) on his head and definitely struggles with all those similar-looking (and sounding) French words. This is the book for you if youre looking for a challenge and would like to discover all the numerous French words that look almost identical despite their dramatically different meanings. As a kid, I remember loving the mysterious story of la sorciere de la rue Mouffetard (the witch of Mouffetard street) and other magical tales dedicated to the people living near rue Brocca in Paris. Between an old witch who just discovered a formula to become young again, Scoubidou, a doll which can see the future and the strange story of Lustucru, this book will fascinate you from the first page to the last and make you forget your reading in French. Delphine and Marinette, two school girls living in a farm team up with speaking animals to fight the oppression of their strict parents who see the animals as nothing more than objects to be used and eaten. Written for children from 4 to 75-year-old, Les Contes du Chat Perch is often the first real book French children read. Called a mix of Le Petit Prince and Le Seigneur des anneaux (The Lord of the Rings) by some readers, Voyage au pays des Arbres invites you to follow a bored boy who decides to enter a mysterious forest and discover all the life and magic hidden behind its tall trees. The boy quickly becomes friend with the trees and discover that theyre much more than simple pieces of wood.
